RM of Riding Mountain West

Purpose of the Program:

The purpose of the Beaver Control Program is to control the beaver population within the RM of Riding Mountain West.

Background:

In recent years beavers have become an increasing problem within the municipality boundaries. Beavers and the structures that they create cause many issues in all agricultural sectors, leading to flooding of property and roads that become a public safety concern. Beaver dams also cause the flooding of crop and pasture lands, which can have a negative financial impact on the municipality and property owners. Beavers can also block culverts causing the obstruction of waterways further leading to some negative impacts on ecologically sensitive areas, infrastructure, and the economy. The beavers creating this sort of damage are defined as nuisance beavers.

Program Outline:

The RM of Riding Mountain West is administering a Beaver Control Program. The program is designed to achieve maximum results and accountability. To address this issue, the RM of Riding Mountain West will pay \$30.00 per beaver carcass. The program will run from April 1, 2023 to October 31, 2023 or until allocated funds have been depleted, whichever comes first. The funds will be administered on a first come first served basis as the 2023 Beaver Control Claim Forms are submitted. No trapper will be paid more than \$510.00 per year. Only ratepayers of the RM of Riding Mountain West will be considered for this program. The program will be re-evaluated on an ongoing basis, time frames are subject to change based on weather and requirements at the CAO's discretion.

The intent is to reduce the financial impact on municipal infrastructure repairs and replacement.

Making a Claim - Submit to the RM of Riding Mountain West by November 1, 2023:

1. Fill out the 2023 Beaver Control Claim Form
2. Name & Address of Trapper
3. Date of removal of beaver for each location listed – *must fall within program dates*
4. Legal land description of where the beavers were removed.
5. Verification of the number of beavers removed from each location listed:
 - Obtain the approval of a member of council or the CAO.
 - Arrange a meeting with a member of Council or take beavers to the Inglis office within the hours of operation to be verified.
 - Have a Council member or the CAO verify the number of beavers brought to landfill and what is listed on the 2023 Beaver Control Claim Form.
 - The Council member or CAO will mark each beaver carcass.
 - The Council member or CAO will sign off on the 2023 Beaver Control Claim Form
 - Trapper will drop off the 2023 Beaver Control Claim Form to the RM office in Inglis at 118 Main Street.

1	The authority granted by this permit is limited to the permit holder or their designate. This permit must be carried by the permit holder, or an initialed copy must be carried by their designate, while conducting the activities authorized herein.		
2	The permit holder shall not dispose of the carcass or pelt of a wild animal, or part thereof, taken under the authority of this permit, except at a landfill site authorized to take dead animals, by surrendering it to a Sustainable Development district office or disposed of as directed by a conservation officer. This permit does not authorize the possession of wild animals, except as required for disposal.		
3	This permit is not valid on private land without permission of the owner or lawful occupant. On Crown land, written permission must be granted by officials from the department responsible for its administration.		
4	The permit holder shall report in writing, the number and species of animals taken under this permit, to the district office where the permit was issued within fifteen (15) days of permit expiry or at the conclusion of the action, whichever occurs sooner.		
5	The Government of Manitoba shall not be held responsible or liable for any damage, injury or loss sustained to the person or property of the permit holder or for any damage, injury or loss sustained by any other person or the property of any other person as a result of the exercise of a right or privilege granted herein.		
6	The exercise, by the permit holder, of a right or privilege granted herein shall be construed as acceptance of and agreement to comply with the conditions set out herein.		
7	This permit may be cancelled or the conditions amended at any time.
