Transmitting information by e-mail has a number of risks residents should be aware of. These include, but are not limited to, the following:

- E-mail can be circulated, forwarded, and stored in numerous paper and electronic files.
- E-mail can be immediately broadcast worldwide and be received by many intended and unintended recipients.
- E-mail senders can easily misaddress an email.
- E-mail is easier to falsify than handwritten or signed documents.
- Back-up copies of e-mail may exist even after the sender or recipient has deleted their copy.
- E-mail can be intercepted, altered, forwarded, or used without authorization or detection.
- E-mail can be used to introduce viruses into computer systems.
- E-mail ca e used as evidence in court.

The RM of Riding Mountain West will use reasonable means to protect the security and confidentiality of e-mail information sent and received. However, because of the risks outlined above, the municipality cannot guarantee the security or confidentiality of e-mail communication, and will not be liable for improper disclosure of confidential information. For this reason, the customer must consent to the use of e-mail for delivery of municipal notices.

<u>Consent of the use of e-mail for the delivery of municipal notices includes agreement with the following:</u>

- 1. Failure to receive an e-mail municipal notices does not release me from my responsibility to pay any charges specified on the notice, or any penalties which may be incurred by late payment.
- 2. I will inform the Municipality of any changes in my e-mail address as soon as possible, to prevent the misdirection of notices and reduce the risk of not receiving the notice.
- 3. I may withdraw from e-mail delivery at any time. To do so I will inform the RM of Riding Mountain West, and all notices going forward will be sent by regular mail.
